In 2018, NSWNMA delegates at Committee of Delegates passed a resolution in support of the Uluru Statement from the Heart. In acting on the democratic decision of members, the NSWNMA is supporting the proposal to establish an Indigenous Voice that is enshrined in the Constitution.

We're asking nurses and midwives to back this campaign as a priority because:



The Voice will allow Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people a greater say in the decision-making processes that impact their communities.



By having greater input, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people can assist the government on policy that will lead to greater health outcomes.



Nurses and midwives are tasked with supporting the health of all Australians. A Yes vote will help deliver better health outcomes for the nation's traditional custodians.



Our constitution is more than 120 years old, yet it still doesn't formally recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. It's time to change this.



The Voice will be a representative advisory body that gives advice on laws made specifically for, and about, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. It will have no power beyond that.
